Dear Mercy High School students, alumnae, parents, faculty, and staff,

At the beginning of August, we shared with you Mercy High School's commitment to actively improve the experience of our Black girls at Mercy. As a first step in our journey, we will be holding listening sessions for the Black members of our community—students (sophomores, juniors and seniors), parents, alumnae, faculty, and staff. Through these listening sessions, we seek to broaden our understanding of their experiences at Mercy High School and of the barriers to an inclusive and equitable community.

The goals of the listening session are to:

- 1. Create a safe space for authentic and challenging dialogue around race, racism, diversity, equity, and inclusion at Mercy.
- 2. Gather information that will help guide future efforts around student life and discipline, communication, professional development, and alumnae engagement.

The listening sessions will be facilitated by an independent consultant, Ms. Michelle Black. In addition to her consulting work, Ms. Black is the director of diversity, equity and inclusion at Stone Ridge School of the Sacred Heart, one of the leading Catholic girls' schools in the Washington, D.C. area. She will be supported in the listening sessions by Ms. Niakia Cheese, our newly appointed director of equity and inclusion. Click here to learn more about these two dynamic and thoughtful women.
