IN MEMORIAM SR. CAROL WHEELER, RSM



As we shared with you via a special email and on Facebook, we were saddened by the news that Sister Carol E. Wheeler, RSM, Mercy's former president, principal, and teacher, died at 5:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 15, at Stella Maris after a long illness. She was 84 years old.

A native of Mobile, Alabama, Sister Carol entered the Sisters of Mercy in 1959 in Mount Washington and was known as Sister Seraphia in the early years of her religious life. She came to Mercy High School as an English and religion teacher in 1961. She left Mercy in 1972 to complete graduate work in philosophy at Georgetown University. She also pursued advanced study at the University of Chicago and Yale University. In 1977, Sister Carol became principal of Mercy and continued in that role until 2009, when she was named

president. Although her administrative duties were significant, she taught seniors in her signature class, *Introduction to Philosophical Thinking*, until she concluded her tenure as president in 2013.

Under Sister Carol's leadership, Mercy established a number of innovative academic offerings including the Honors Program and the Mentor Program, and she led the fundraising and construction of the Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Auditorium and the Dorothy Williams Bunting Science Center. Sister Carol was a creative and influential educator in the United States, and a sabbatical in New Zealand extended her network internationally.

CONNECTING WOMEN OF MERCY WITH TODAY'S MERCY GIRLS



Lauren Waldt, Esq. '06, Judicial Law Clerk for the Department of Justice, Immigration Court of Memphis, Tennessee, shared her expertise with some of our Mercy students in our signature Law and Social Action Program. Lauren earned her Bachelor of Science degree in International Relations from James Madison University followed by her Juris Doctor degree from the University of Baltimore School of Law in 2020. Prior to attending law school, Lauren's passion and desire to serve marginalized people, which was inspired by her time as a Mercy student, led her to work at the International Rescue Committee Baltimore and Health Care for the Homeless. As a law student, Lauren was accepted into the prestigious Department of Justice Honors Program in the Immigration Division. Lauren was admitted to the Tennessee Bar in June 2021.



Unissa Cruse '10 returned to Mercy twice as a guest instructor for the Dance Exploration for All class, sharing her knowledge and teaching our Mercy Girls hip hop as part of their unit of study. Unissa has performed extensively throughout the United States and Canada, including roles in "West Side Story," "Mary Poppins," and several plays and short films. In the Baltimore area, Unissa is best-known for winning the "Hairspray Live!" competition, earning a role in the nationally televised NBC production.



MERCY MAGIC VARSITY SOFTBALL: 2021 IAAM B Conference Champions






